<u>Open Afternoon Feedback</u>

Almost all our families who completed the Open Afternoon event feedback survey $(97\%)^{*}_{A}$ agreed that they had a better understanding of how their child is learning. There are a number $*^{*}_{A}$ of comments on how it was good to see the different ways Technology is used in the classroom $*^{*}_{A}$ and this could be something we build on in the future. There were also suggestions of doing $*^{*}_{A}$ this again later in the year. We are delighted that the latter was mentioned, as we plan to $*^{*}_{A}$ invite families to the classrooms after class assemblies to see what pupils have been learning, $*^{*}_{A}$ Great minds think alike!

We had a very good response rate to our question about what age children should be allowed to bring mobile phones to school. The most popular answer (by some way) was 'Never'. However, there were many families concerned about safety walking home etc and noted how having a phone provides an extra layer of reassurance/safety. We do understand this and know would NOT have an out right ban on mobile phones being brought to school. Our know having their phone) but understand there know have exceptions to this.

Mobile phones in schools have caused a number of issues in recent years, in spite of putting in $\frac{1}{4}$ mitigating measures, such as asking pupils to hand them in to their teachers. A good suggestion $\frac{1}{4}$ from Hillside Parent Group, was that if a pupil is using their phone in the school day (when it $\frac{1}{4}$ should have been handed in), it must be collected by parents at the school office.

A Moving forward, we plan to issue guidance for parents/pupils about taking mobile phones, which $\overset{\star}{}_{A}$ will hopefully make our position clear and at least reduce problems. *More to come on this* $\overset{\star}{}_{A}$ *soon.*
